## ROYAL AUSTRALASIAN COLLEGE OF SURGEONS PRIMARY EXAMINATION FOR FELLOWSHIP

- 1. A Primary Examination in Anatomy (including Normal Histology) and Applied Physiology and the Principles of Pathology will be conducted in Singapore in February, 1961.
- The written papers will be held on Friday and Saturday, 17th and 18th February, 1961. The viva voce section will begin on Monday, 20th February, 1961.
- 3. The examination is reciprocal with the Primary Examination for Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, The Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, the Royal Faculty of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow and the College of Physicians and Surgeons of South Africa.
- 4. The examination is open to graduates of not less than one year's standing of a Medical School approved by the Council of the College for the purpose.
- 5. Candidates must submit evidence of their qualifications and of the date of acquirement thereof. Original certificates of graduation should not be sent, but the candidates should obtain a Certificate in the form of a letter from their University, which is for permanent retention of the College examination records and cannot be returned to candidates.
- 6. Forms of application for admission to the examination may be obtained from either the Director of Medical Services, Singapore, or the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Małaya in Singapore, Sepoy Lines, Singapore 3.
- 7. The fee for admission to the examination is £31.10.0 Australian currency (\$M216.39). The fee must be forwarded with the form of application and the University Certificate so as to reach the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Malaya in Singapore, Sepoy Lines, Singapore 3, not later than the 30th November, 1960.

- 8. It is stressed that entries close at the Dean's office in Singapore on the 30th November, 1960, and that late entries cannot be accepted.
- 9. Further enquiries should be addressed to the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Malaya in Singapore, Sepoy Lines, Singapore 3.

## STUDY COURSE FOR THE EXAMINATION

Through the generosity of the Australian Commonwealth Government under the Colombo Plan, the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons is arranging not only for the primary examination to be held in Singapore, but also for a preliminary course of teaching to be given by experienced teachers from Australia.

This teaching course for the examination will be held in the Faculty of Medicine, Singapore, beginning on Monday, 2nd January, 1961 and concluding not later than Friday, 10th February, 1961.

Entries for the course must be lodged with the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Malaya in Singapore, Sepoy Lines, Singapore 3, not later than the 30th November, 1960.

A separate application form must be completed for entry to the Study Course in preparation for the examination. This form is obtainable from the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Malaya in Singapore, Sepoy Lines, Singapore 3.

The fee for the course is thirty-one guineas Sterling (\$M315) which should be paid to the Dean when entries are lodged.

All candidates for the primary examination strongly are advised to take advantage of this special study course.

Singapore Government Medical Officers wishing to enter for the examination and/or the study course are advised to make their applications as early as possible through the Medical Superintendents of the institutions in which they are working.
