THE NUTRITION SOCIETY FORTHCOMING MEETINGS

Friday, February 9, 1962

The Scottish Group of The Nutrition Society will hold a meeting for the presentation of original communications in Ayr. Titles of papers or demonstrations, each with an abstract not exceeding 400 words, should be sent to Dr. D. G. Armstrong, The Hannah Research Institute, Ayr, not later than December 15, 1961. The abstract, which will be published in the Society's Proceedings, must be prepared according to the direction to contributors published in the Proceedings of The Nutrition Society and the top copy in final form should be submitted, as no proofs will be sent out. No abstract will be published unless the communication has been made at the meeting, and papers will be included in the programme as far as possible in order of receipt.

FAO/WHO MISSION ON TRAINING IN NUTRITION IN EUROPE.

A team has been appointed to visit a number of European countries in November and Decem-

ber 1961 to discuss training in nutrition with government authorities responsible for education, public health and agriculture and with persons concerned with graduate and postgraduate studies in medicine, veterinary science, agriculture, food science and technology and home economics, and in teacher training. The team will visit Great Britain from December 1 to 7 for discussions in London and Glasgow. The members of the team are Professor E. J. Bigwood of the University of Brussels, Miss A. M. Copping of the University of London and Professor C. den Hartog, Director of the Bureau of Nutrition at the Hague. All three members of the team hope to attend The Nutrition Society meeting on December 2 and to have informal discussions, particularly over lunch and tea, with members of the Society who are interested in the problems of education in nutrition.
