After the untimely death of Dr. A. P. Meiklejohn great difficulty had been experienced in appointing an Organising Secretary but recently Dr. C. P. Stewart, Chairman of the Organising Committee announced that Miss A. W. Watson — a retired Civil Servant from the Department of Health — had kindly undertaken the task. Some £2,600 has already been contributed by various firms towards meeting the cost of the Congress. The programme for the Congress will comprise ten symposia, at least two special lectures and the presentation of original communications. Organisation of and arrangements for, the symposia are now well advanced. To assist the Organising Committee in the work of arranging the Congress sub-committees to deal with Programmes, Finance and Entertainments have been set up. The Chairman of these respective sub-committees are Dr. C. P. Stewart, Dr. J. A. B. Smith and Dr. R. H. Girdwood, Dr. D. G. Armstrong has undertaken the responsibility of arranging pre- and post-Congress tours.
