The 6th International Congress of Nutrition

At a meeting of the General Congress Committee in Edinburgh on April 6, 1962, reports on the progress of arrangements for the Congress were submitted by the Organising Committee and by the Finance, Programmes and Entertainments Sub-committees. Dr. Bolton gave a report on the Trade and Scientific Exhibition to be held in Adam House, University of Edinburgh and Dr. Armstrong presented one on the proposed outline of the Pre- and Post-Congress Tours. Arrangements for providing accommodation were detailed

by A. Thompson, Esq. on behalf of Thos. Cook & Son Ltd. It is estimated that the Congress will cost £25,000. It is intended that half of the cost will be raised through membership fees from those attending the Congress, the remainder being contributed by commercial firms and other organisations. The total of these contributions to date amounts to £5,060.

Members will recall that a year or more ago they received a preliminary announcement concerning the 6th International Congress of Nutrition and were asked to return the enclosed postcard if they wished to receive further notices about the Congress. ROYAL AUSTRALASIAN COLLEGE OF SURGEONS

The Victorian State Committee is arranging a course of instruction in post-graduate surgery to be held in Melbourne from the 30th July to the 5th October, 1962.

The course will be full time. During the mornings entrants will, with some restrictions, be able to attend and observe the work in the various clinical schools. Tuition will begin each week day at 2.00 p.m. and at 4.00 p.m. on each day there will be a session on Clinical Surgery. The course has been so arranged to enable anyone, who wishes to do so, to take off 12 weeks prior to the Final Examination for the F.R.A.C.S. in October, to prepare for this examination. In addition, the Clinical instruction is being conducted in the late afternoons, in order that senior

resident medical officers may be able to attend this part of the course.

The fees for the course are —

- (a) Full time 20 Gns.
- (b) Clinical only 10 Gns.

Entries for the course close on the 13th July, 1962. Candidates when entering must forward a remittance for the fee, viz. 20 Gns. or 10 Gns. as the case may be, plus exchange in the case of candidates resident in Australia, for cheques drawn on banks outside Melbourne. Candidates resident in New Zealand, or elsewhere, should remit by bank draft drawn on Melbourne in favour of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, and payable in Australian currency.
