British Railways' Concession Fares

As an experiment to the end of 1963, British Railways have introduced a new facility for those travelling individually to attend meetings,

where the meetings will be attended by not fewer than 50 persons. The facility will also be available to wives and children and tickets will be valid for 17 days and be available for travel on any day, except at Bank Holiday week-ends and on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from the third week-end in June to the end of August. The basis of the fare will be the single fare and one half for the return journey, fractions of 3d. to be reckoned as 3d. First class tickets will be available at 50% over the second class fare. The facility will be available upon surrender of a voucher and payment of the fare at a B.R. booking office.
