Dr. Cheah Seng Kee entered the College of Medicine before the war in 1939. After the war when medical education in this country was resumed, he came back to complete his studies, and was awarded the Diploma in Medicine and Surgery in 1949. Thereafter he served in the General Hospital his housemanship, when there was an acute shortage of staff, and house doctors literally were worked off their feet.

After the internship, he demonstrated his adventurous spirit by accepting a Johore Government contract at a much higher salary then currently prevailing, and with a much greater diversity of responsibility. Completion

of the contract saw him back in Singapore engaged in General practice till his untimely demise in May this year.

Affectionately nick-named "the potato", he reflected a personality which was accessible, friendly, rounded, and yet sincere. Those who knew him appreciated that here was a man who would never refuse when approached for help. Perhaps, it may be said of him that if he should err, it would be in his enthusiasm to be of assistance. His death is a loss to his family, his patients and his friends.
