The First International Congress on Group Medicine is sponsored by the Canadian Association of Medical Clinics and is endorsed by The Canadian Medical Association, The Association of Canadian Medical Colleges, L'Association des Médecins de Langue Française du Canada, The College of Family Physicians of Canada, and The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. The purpose of the Congress is to correlate and exchange experiences in the organization and administration of medical group practice in various countries and to present new ideas for its future development.

The program will emphasize the responsibility of the health professions in the provision of services to the community. Inter-group re-

search and continuing medical education will be discussed. The use of automated and computer equipment in private group practice and in hospitals will be presented.

"The Second World Congress of the International Society of Tropical Dermatology will take place on August 15-20, 1969, in Kyoto, Japan. The main themes are the following: 1) Systemic mycoses, 2) Trepanomatoses and Venereal diseases, 3) Parasitic skin diseases, 4) Leishmaniosis, 5) Effect of nutrition and malnutrition of the skin, 6) Geographic ecology, 7) Bioclimatology, 8) Free communications. Symposia and Round Table Conferences will be offered on the following topics: 1) Pigmentation and Dyschromia Peculiar to the Tropics, 2) Mycobacterial Infections, 3) Allergic Manifestations of the Skin in the Tropics, 4) Skin Cancer, 5) Common Dermatoses: Clinical and Therapeutic Aspects.

6) Diseases of the Hair, 7) Mycotic Diseases, 8) Diseases of the Nails, 9) Radiation Therapy in Dermatology.
