EDITORIAL NOTICE

Papers, case reports, Association notes, etc. should reach the Editor at least eight weeks before the date of publication of any number. Papers and case reports are accepted on the understanding that they have not been and will not be published in whole or in part in any other journal, and are subject to editorial revision. The Editor reserves the right to publish any paper read before the meetings of the Association.

Manuscripts sent for publication should be concise and type-written on one side of the paper only with double line spacing and a left margin of not less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Only recognized abbreviations, e.g., cm. or lb., should be used in the text. Manuscripts should be carefully revised, as alterations in print are costly.

Illustrations must be on separate sheets ready for reproduction; they should be on thick, smooth, white paper. Photographs should be printed on glossy paper. Special arrangements must be made with the Editor for printing of colour plates. All papers and case reports should be well illustrated, such illustrations being not only helpful to the author in his description but also to the reader in his understanding thereof.

Only papers closely related to the author's work should be referred to in the text; exhaustive lists should be avoided. References in the text should be made by giving the author's surname, with the year of publication in brackets. All references should be brought together at the end of the paper in alphabetical order and should mention: (1) name(s) followed by the initials of the author(s); (2) year of publication in brackets; (3) title of paper; (4) abbreviated title of the Journal according to the World List of Scientific Periodicals; (5) volume; (6) number of the first page of the article, e.g.:—

Abernathy, R. S. (1959) Clinical Manifestations of pulmonary Blastomycosis. Ann. Intern. Med., 51, 707.

References to books and monographs should include: (1) author(s) or editor(s); (2) year of publication; (3) title; (4) edition; (5) page referred to; (6) place; (7) publisher, e.g.:—

Wood, P. (1956) Diseases of the Heart and Circulation, 2nd Ed., 352. London: Eyre and Spottiswoode.

Galley proofs will be submitted to the contributors for minor corrections, and should be returned to the Editor within three days. Major alterations to the text cannot be accepted.

Authors of papers and case reports published in the Singapore Medical Journal receive 20 reprints free of charge. Additional numbers can be supplied on payment provided application is made when submitting the manuscript.
