W.H.O. INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR ON CEREBRO-VASCULAR DISEASES MONACO, MAY 25-30, 1970

A seminar with advisors, invitees, and national participants was held in Monaco recently. Singapore, Japan and Australia were the only countries outside Europe represented. Dr. Gwee Ah Leng attended as an invitee. Thirteen nations participated in the Seminar which had a total attendance of almost 50 doctors.

Working in closed sessions, by means of plenary sessions and small groups, the seminar resulted in a report to the W.H.O. highlighting the need to study cerebro-vascular diseases throughout the whole world, since it is a major killer of the people in the older age groups, and the most important cause of disability of a prolonged nature. The groups comprising doctors from different disciplines—neurology,

surgery, pathology etc.—came to a common agreement that the present attack on the problem of cerebro-vascular diseases was best conducted along the following lines:—

- (a) Prevention especially through the control of hypertension.
- (b) International cooperative research into associated factors like ischaemic heart disease, diabetes, hypercholestrolemia and conditions like smoking.
- (c) Collection of uniform data to permit analysis.

For the above purposes, the participants at the seminar designed a simple classification with diagnostic criteria for field use, and recommend that wherever possible, a national stroke register should be established.
