HARIDAS MEMORIAL LECTURE

The Singapore Paediatric Society in conjunction with the Society of Private Practice will be holding the next Haridas Memorial Lecture on Friday, October 22, 1971, at the Pathology Lecture Theatre, Outram Road General Hospital, Singapore 3.

The Lecture is held annually to commemorate the death of an eminent member of the medical profession, the late Dr. Gopal Haridas, who died on August 6, 1964.

The late Dr. Haridas is rightly called the father of Paediatrics in this country for it was through his untiring efforts that Paediatrics became established here.

A special Haridas Memorial Lecture Fund was created mainly from contributions from the medical profession and is for the sole purpose of organising the Memorial Lecture and has as its

primary objective the promotion of research in diseases of children and the advancement of child care in this country.

The first lecture was delivered by Professor Wong Hock Boon, Professor of Paediatrics at the University of Singapore and was entitled "Haemoglobinopathies in Singapore".

Dr. Tan Kwang Hoh, the former Senior Paediatric Specialist at the Outram Road General Hospital, Singapore, delivered the 2nd lecture on "Kernicterus and Cerebral Palsy."

The 3rd lecture was awarded to Dr. Loh Tee Fun, Lecturer in the Department of Paediatrics, University of Singapore, for his paper on "Congenital Heart Diseases in Singapore."

ROYAL AUSTRALASIAN COLLEGE OF SURGEONS
 PRIMARY FELLOWSHIP EXAMINATION
 SINGAPORE

Council has directed that a multiple-choice paper form a component of the written Primary Fellowship Examination of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons in Singapore, and this will be included in the September 1971 examination. The oral examination will remain unchanged. The form the examination will now take is as follows, but it is probable that other changes will be introduced in 1973.

Anatomy: Written examination (three hours); two out of three essay questions (one and a half hours); 100 multiple-choice questions (one and a half hours); oral examination (20 minutes).

Physiology and the Principles of Pathology: Written examination (three hours); two out of three short essay questions in Physiology and one out of two short essay questions in the Principles of Pathology (one hour); 75 multiple-choice questions in Physiology (one hour); 75 multiple-choice questions in the Principles of Pathology (one hour); oral examination, Physiology (10 minutes); Principles of Pathology (10 minutes).

Illustrative types of the multiple-choice questions to be used in the written papers can be obtained from the College on request. It should be noted that the Modified Primary Examination for candidates intending to present for the final examination in Ophthalmology will remain unchanged. The written section will be held on or about 17th and 18th September 1971. The viva voce section will commence on or about 20th September 1971. Entries for this examination close on 2nd August 1971, and it is stressed that late entries cannot be accepted. Copies of the Regulations governing the examination, and entry forms can be obtained from the Examination Secretary, Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, Spring Street, Melbourne, Victoria, 3000, Australia.
