NEONATAL SURGERY

London 29 February - 12 March 1976

This course on neonatal surgery has been designed for general surgeons who confine their work to the care of children. It will be concerned mainly with the diagnosis and treatment of congenital anomalies and other surgical emergencies occurring during the first month of life. The appropriate aspects of genito-urinary, neurological, cardiac, plastic and orthopaedic surgery, the physiological basis of supportive treatment of the newly born and recent advances in anaesthesia will also be included.

The Director of Studies will be Professor A.W. Wilkinson, Nuffield Professor of Paediatric Surgery, Institute of Child Health, The Hospital for Sick Children, Great Ormond Street, London.

The course will be held at The Hospital for Sick Children, Great Ormond Street and in the Institute of Child Health which is part of the Postgraduate Medical Federation of the University of London. The programme will consist of demonstrations, lectures, discussions and operating sessions by members of the staff of the Institute and Hospital.

QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS

This course is intended for experienced general surgeons from overseas who devote the majority of their working time to the surgical care of children.
